And then - "Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye h ve done it unto me." (Matt. 25:35-36, fo.)

Jim put down the Bible and in his attempt to rid himself of these accusing words and he started debating within himself, the issue that they raised.

And he thought to himself, "Well, the man wasn't necessarily hungry or thirsty or sick, - was he? He certainly wasn't naked or in prison.

It read: Determine your actions by the criterion - "What would Jesus Do"? "What was his pattern of living"?

Let us remember brethren and sisters, The Savior said, "I am the way the truth and the life: no man cometh unto the Father but by me."

He has given us the pattern. Let us ever pray for strength and courage and wisdom that we shall be able to follow it. That we shall be able to follow after Him.
