We have been told something in regard to her life - and I might add a little more in regard to this family.

HE WAS Born in 1870 of IN SPRINGVILLE BLABSAME.

Our father was the son of a veteran of the Civil War. The family was baptized in Springville attack in 1879. They had planned to move out to Arizona 3 years later but remained in the South until 1887 in order to provide a place where the missionaries could stay and cared for. Church officials had requested they do this. In 1887 when our dad was 17 years old, they came to Mesa, Arizona, which had been settled 9 years before.

Our Mother's father was Born in Nauvoo, Illinois on February 26, 1846 - just about 3 weeks after the firstwwagons rolled out of Nauvoo to cross the Mississippi an headed West. His father had been baptised in the Dupage River about 25 miles south of Chicago in December of 1831, when less than two years after the Church was organized. Cheege 2500 Papple.

Our mother was married born in Montpelier. Bear Lake County, Idaho. in 1874, Our Mother's mother was born on the plains of lowa in Pottawattami County on the trail west, in 1850.

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Our mother arrived in Mesa, Arizona in 1879, before her 5th birthday and 1 year after Mesa was settled.

In 1892 Dad and mother were married, and then went by team and wagon with to the temple in St. George Utak and were sealed there. We were all born in the Covenant. Our Roots Har Drap IN LDS HISTORY.

When mother died in 1917, she left 10 children between the ages of one month and 24 years. Minnie was I7, and there were 7 children who were 13 and younger to be cared for.


And so Christ was the <u>first fruits</u> and the account of His literal resurrection is told in the Gospel **at** according to John - And he tells it this way - in part.
